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Message from our Head of Campus

In 2024, DBFS showed some of the highest level of engagement in programs right across the school, evident in the high numbers that continued to turn up each day. Young people completed more classwork than ever, and each young person engaged not only in classroom learning, but in a large range of out-of-the-class events and activities. Such activities included sport, music, art, hospitality, coffee-making, Big Ears challenges, and First Nations events. A highlight for many of the students were the Senior Formal, Christmas Party, Halloween activities and the Disney-themed Participation Party. Our young people exercised their leadership skills through high quality engagement in a variety of activities, TAFE qualifications, school-based traineeships, community volunteering, day sailing, rallies and marches for local causes, bike maintenance, candle and jewellery making, gardening and success in part-time jobs.

Young people showed amazing maturity to work together to create whole school working agreements, and responded by raising the bar around the principle of respect and how this was shown to each other on site each day. A number of elders engaged with our community, including our local Police Liaison Officer and respect was shown with First Nations peoples and cultures through NAIDOC Week activities, the Sorry Day walk, Respect Day, conversations around the renewal of our Reconciliation Action Plan, and increased involvement in the Cultural Connections program.

Staff also engaged in ongoing professional development throughout the year. The Doing Schools Differently Conference, which was held this year in Brisbane, highlighted the enormous growth in Alternative Education, provided opportunities for skill building in a variety of areas, and establish connections with a variety of other organisations engaged in the industry. Further to this, all staff engaged throughout the year in Professional Supervision, seeking continual growth and engaging in high quality reflective practice.

Our weekly Wellbeing Program provided an opportunity for Young People in both Middle and Senior Schools to meet separately and discuss relevant topics on areas of personal growth, including issues of respectful relationships, healthy lifestyles and social media. With the guidance of external counsellors and youth worker supports, our Young People expanded their problem-solving skills. They engaged in honest and respectful conversations, along with many Collaborative Problem Solving meetings to resolve issues and develop skills, and demonstrated great improvements in positive interactions and encouraging words to help each other achieve their potential.

SCHOOL OVERVIEW

Deception Bay Flexible School is a part of Edmund Rice Education Australia Flexible Schools Ltd who provide a second, third or fourth chance to young people who have disengaged from mainstream schools, with a focus on radical inclusion, hope and opportunity. Deception Bay Flexible School commenced operation in 2006 as a registered co-educational Catholic school in the Edmund Rice tradition.

At Flexis, we do things differently. We walk, learn and work together with young people on Common Ground; we build relationships, and every member of the community commits to doing their best to work within our four principles of Respect, Participation, Honesty, and Safe and Legal.

Across our Flexi Schools and Special Education Schools in almost every state and territory in Australia, we support young people with strengths-based, trauma-aware learning. Often young people come to our Flexis thinking they cannot learn – we show them they can. We make sure young people feel safe, welcome and empowered to succeed. We provide young people with the opportunity to define what will work best for them, with services to adapt to their needs.

First Nations influence

Since the very beginning, we have walked in solidarity with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, advocating for change and promoting reconciliation. At Flexis one third of our young people and 10% of our educators identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander.

As a priority, we are working to strengthen the cultural capacity of our entire workforce. We are working to make sure the system values and respects First Nations peoples and perspectives, to build Indigenous leadership at every level of our organisation, and to ensure that First Nations young people experience the highest quality education possible in the safest and most dynamic schools in the country.

DISTINCTIVE CURRICULUM OFFERINGS

Deception Bay Flexible School offers holistic learning experiences that address the social needs of our young people, and promotes their emotional, physical, spiritual, and academic development. Our education programs are attuned to the individual by an assessment of need and delivery within a supportive environment. The purpose of this personalized approach is to engage the young person with their learning and empower them to take responsibility for their actions and learning, achieve greater autonomy and self-reliance and to engage in the transition to further education and/or employment.

Social Climate

STUDENT WELLBEING

At Deception Bay Flexible School, the wellbeing and best interests of our young people is our primary consideration. Together with our young people, their families, external service providers, and the community, we build positive learning environments and safe and support spaces to address young people's wellbeing. Through elements of leadership, inclusion, young people voice, partnerships, and support, our pastoral care program is designed to foster supportive relationships to monitor student progress, to advocate on their behalf, to provide advice, direction, and support during difficult personal issues, and overall to support our young people in the achievement of their stated personal and education goals.

DBFS provides a range of weekly wellbeing support for young people, from mindfulness activities and self-regulation skill-building, Collaborative Problem Solving meetings, and the weekly wellbeing course for both Middle & Senior School. Young people are also provided the option of engaging with our on-site counsellor once a week, along with drug and alcohol counselling through Ted Noffs. Art Therapy session throughout the year also allowed young people to express themselves in new ways.

FAMILY AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

At Deception Bay Flexible School, we consider our families and carers as partners of the school in their young person's education experience. Families and the wider school community are welcomed into our school throughout the school year for various events and activities as interested parties of our school and our young people. Deception Bay Flexible School continuously plans and seeks out ways to partner with families and community, recognizing the benefit of these partnerships for our young people, our school, and our community.

DBFS participated in a variety of community initiatives, including annual events Clean Up Australia Day, International Women's Day Breakfast, March Against Violence, Australia's Biggest Morning Tea and our very own Sorry Day Walk. We engaged actively with government agencies to support Young People in engaging positively with support systems in the community. We also had regular visits from our Police Liaison Officer, Uncle Roy, along with a number of visitors from other schools and organisations for our NAIDOC Week activities. Deception Bay Flexi continued to maintain it's partnership with other Flexi schools in the community, along with organisations such as Younity in Deception Bay and a variety of local businesses and training organisations, to provide employment opportunities for a variety of Young People.
